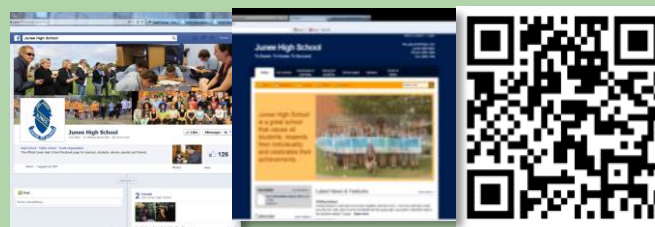

Electronic Devices policy

Goodstart Small Steps Program

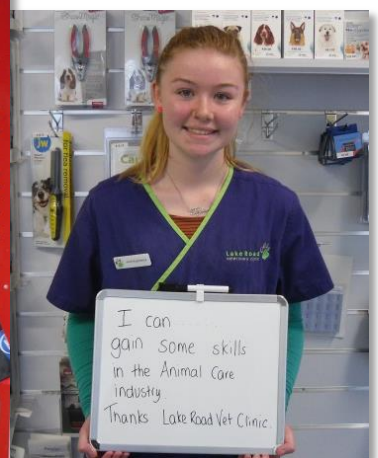

Work Experience

Just a reminder that students in Stage 5 are encouraged to undertake at least one week of work experience this year. Work Experience is a valuable program as it allows students to gain employability skills as well as allowing them to research different careers that they are interested in. Paperwork is available from the Careers Office or by downloading the correct forms on the school careers website www.juneehighcareers.com Please give employers at least two weeks' notice with potential dates. There are quite a lot of students who have not taken part in this program so far this year. Students must be on the right level and have attendance of 85% or above to be able to undertake work experience.



It is not too early to start planning for work experience in 2017. If a student wants to try something "out of the box" like work experience at Taronga Park Zoo or the ABC Studios then these placements ideally need to be organised this year as they fill very fast. Some of these placements only allow one student per school. I will be speaking to the Stage 5 students about this in the next few weeks. 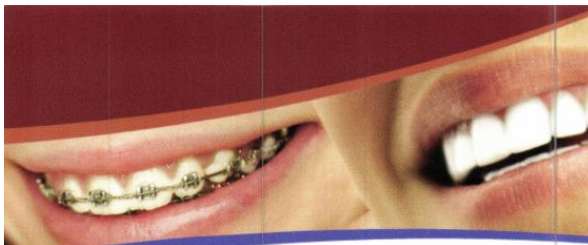

SEXTING AND CYBER-SAFETY: protecting your child online



Mobile phones are a part of day-to-day life for most children and young adults, and the lines can blur between communication that is appropriate and that which puts them at risk. 'Sexting' – sending provocative images via text message – is a growing trend you need to be aware of to protect your child.

Studies show that many parents don't always understand what their children are doing online. With the growth in smartphone technology and social networking sites like Facebook and Twitter, it's time to get up to speed with your kids' tech habits.

Photos were once the domain of the family photo album, but the proliferation of digital photography, mobile phone cameras, social networking sites and blogs now means images can quickly travel across cyber-space and be viewed by thousands of people.

Sharing photos between friends is fun, and sending provocative photos might seem innocent and flirtatious. However, sexting can leave your child at risk of public humiliation, social isolation and cyber-bullying.

Images can be uploaded onto social networking sites where they can be easily shared or passed around.

It's important for you to monitor your child's online activities, including websites they visit, who they are communicating with, their online 'friends' and the information they are publishing.

Tips for parents:

- Talk to your child about the consequences of sexting.
- Monitor your child's online presence, especially social networking sites like Facebook and Twitter.
- Warn your child about cyber predators, and explain that images can end up in the wrong hands.
- Give your child clear rules on what they can and can't do with their mobile phone, and monitor text messages.
- Encourage your child to be open about receiving provocative images and cyber-bullying.
- Never allow your child to meet up with new online friends without your supervision.
- Remind your child that there are key pieces of information they should never share online, including addresses, photos and video footage.

The Parent Line can help you with the tools needed to talk openly with your child about cyber-safety. It's a parenting advice line, which is staffed by highly trained and experienced counsellors. 1300 1300 52.

The message to young people is – don't send or publish images of yourself and don't distribute any sent to you.

Junee High School Electronic Device Policy

18 October 2016

Introduction

This policy covers the appropriate use of electronic devices at Junee High School as well as appropriate use of the network resources, internet and email system provided at Junee High School.

All of these have the potential to be incorporated into lessons, opening exciting new approaches to learning. When these technologies are misused by students they can be very disruptive to teaching and learning and in some cases cause harm. For the well-being of students, electronic devices should be used to build health and feelings of safety, not distracting students or impacting upon them by missing work, being caught up in negative comments or being focused on their device instead of people or other parts to their life.

Junee High School acknowledges that:

- Students may need to be in possession of an electronic device at school for reasons relating to their safety in travelling to and from school.
- There may be some times during school that electronic devices may be used for lesson delivery and educational engagement. A decision to use an electronic device will be under the explicit direction and supervision of the classroom teacher.

Electronic devices include:

- Portable devices.
- Network, Internet and email usage

1. Portable devices

Mobile phones, digital cameras, MP3 players/iPods, ipads, tablets, game consoles and other similar devices.

- The device is the student's responsibility. Junee High School will not accept any responsibility for the security, loss or damage of the device while in the student's possession.
- During class all devices are to be turned **OFF AND AWAY** in the student's bag.
- Students should not use the device to record images, video or sound (unless under explicit teacher instructions).
- Students should not use device for accessing, downloading or sending inappropriate, offensive or prohibited material.
- Students should not use the device to contact a parent/caregiver during school hours. All such calls or messages should be made from the school administration office. Emergency contact should only be made through the admin office.

a) Junior Students (Years 7 – 10)

- The devices are only to be used in accordance with teacher instructions and only used for educational purposes.
Eg Music class, filming sports for feedback, reading books
- No music during class time

b) Senior Students (Years 11 – 12)

- The devices are only to be used in accordance with teacher instructions.
- A student requiring a connection of a personal laptop or tablet computer will need to see the Computer Coordinator (Mr Hands) for necessary agreements and organise a time for connection to take place.

- Students may listen to music during EMPOWER & study period lessons, setting their playlist, and then leaving their phone alone.

2. Network, Internet and email usage.

Network Resources

JHS provides students with secure storage on the school's network as well as access to some networked printers throughout the school.

- Network storage is capped for each student. When this limit is reached the student will not be able to save any more files to the school server.
- Students should only use the network storage for school based work and resources.
- Students should not save inappropriate or offensive material or games on the schools network.
- Students should not store programs on the school network.
- Printing should only be done with the permission of a teacher.

Internet

JHS provides filtered internet access for students across the school for use in class. This internet service is filtered by the NSW DoE and is intended for research and learning and communication between students and staff.

- The Internet is to be used for educational purposes.
- Students are not to access, download or distribute inappropriate offensive or prohibited material
- Students will not download any material that represents a breach of copyright law.
- Students will not use Wi-Fi to connect devices to unfiltered internet

Email Usage

NSW DoE provides each student with their own email address and webmail service. This is accessible through the DoE student portal. The use of this service is outlined in the DoE's internet and email usage policy.

- Email should be used for educational purposes.
- Students should not share another person's email (staff or student) with someone else.
- Students are not to access, download or distribute inappropriate offensive or prohibited material
- DoE email should not be used to harass, bully or threaten any person or group.

Consequences of a breach of this policy may include:

- Confiscation of the device for collection from the Deputy Principal at the end of the school day.
- Confiscation of the device until such time as a parent/caregiver is able to attend school to collect the device or pending an interview between the student, parent/caregiver and the Deputy Principal or Principal.
- Loss of internet and network privileges for a period of time.
- In cases of bullying, harassment or threatening behaviour, school-based management (detentions, meetings, suspensions) as well as outside agencies such as the police will be involved.
- In cases of refusal to hand over the phone school-based management will be involved.

Devices confiscated will be:

- Turned off by the student.
- Placed in an envelope with the student's name marked on it. Usually the HT will collect to take.
- Taken to the Deputy Principal or Principal and locked in the school safe.
- Device can be picked up at the end of the school day or when student is leaving for the day.

Per term:

First Offence: Sentral entry & warning. Student to collect at the end of the day.	Second Offence: Sentral entry, pre-suspension letter and lunch detention. Parent to collect device.	Third Offence: Suspension for Continued Disobedience. Student is banned from having device at school for remainder of term.
