ALARM

You may have heard your child talk about ALARM in their classes or have seen sheets with more colours, columns and lay out for answers. **ALARM** (A Learning and Responding Matrix) aims to help students answer questions in a more systematic and explicit way. Many teachers are using this matrix in their classes.

ALARM supports students to:

- Understand what the question is asking them to do
- Plan on all the things they need to cover in getting a thorough response
- Write a detailed and logical answer to best show their knowledge.

The benefits to real world situations of using this strategy include understanding which car or phone to buy; writing job applications; evaluating relationships or deciding upon future job opportunities.

More information will be issued to parents including an information session to be held on Thursday 16 June 2016 at 6:00pm prior to the next P&C Meeting.

Burrabinya project

We have been fortunate to be working with Compact to deliver the Burrabinya program. This program is designed to build the capacity of Years 9, 10 & 12 Aboriginal female students through connection with cultural identity and community to develop the confidence, skills, knowledge and understanding required to reach their full potential in employment and education. The program has only been recently begun, but we have seen a development in their skills and confidence to be able to plan their future.

This week saw Jayla Nix talk with the students. Jayla is a young indigenous lady who explained her career path, barriers she has overcome, the importance of her culture and how she won a traineeship award.

NSW Touch Development Officer visit

Our students in Years 7/8 and PASS students were offered a chance to train with a development officer to develop their touch skills and enhance their knowledge of the game. It was a great opportunity and we thank NSW Touch for their support for school touch.

PD/H/PE – Stage 5 Assessment Task

All Stage 5 students were recently issued a theory assessment task in class. Students are required to use the ALARM scaffold provided to write an extended response to the following: "Assess the impact of social media on the health and wellbeing of teenagers".

The ALARM scaffold has been designed to help students with their extended writing. It will support students to organise thoughts and comprehension of concepts as well as enhance the quality of their written responses.

Child Studies Assessment Task

Child Studies students are currently creating learning activities to teach pre-school students the importance of a chosen health and safety issue, eg infectious diseases, hygiene, accidents and injuries, water safety etc. After researching facts related to their topic, in pairs they are to design an interactive learning activity that could be used to teach the concept to young children.

We look forward to these fun presentations in the coming lessons.

PDHPE Elective Fees

Students in Stage 5 PASS and Child Studies are reminded that elective fees are now overdue. It is important these fees are paid so that resources for

these subjects can be purchased and used by the students.

Zone Athletics

Community Transport Scheme

An updated online form to apply for free travel between home and school will be available for students attending schools in rural and regional NSW from Thursday 12 May 2016.

The form can be used by parents, carers and students applying for free school student travel under the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) and provides a single application process for free school travel across NSW.

Schools will no longer stock SSTS application forms (blue form). With 2016 rural and regional travel entitlements already issued for the year, most parents, carers and students won't need to re-apply and should continue to use their current travel entitlement.

A new application will only be required if students change their school, home address or name. Parents, carers and students need to go to transportnsw.info/school-students for new applications or to update their details. A FAQs information sheet from NSW Transport is attached.

2016/17 **Rural and** regional School **Travel Passes**



What's new

From 12 May 2016, applications for school travel passes in rural and regional NSW will need to be completed online instead of using paper forms.

This change makes it easier to apply, as you only need to complete one form that covers all situations, including journeys that involve multiple transport operators or modes of transport.

It's also easier for schools and bus operators, as Transport for NSW will now handle the applications.

This change only affects the application process; no changes to any public transport services are planned.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for a school travel pass, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

Years K-2 (Infants)

There's no minimum distance Years 3-6 (Primary)

1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking. Years 7-12 (Secondary)

2.0km straight line distance or 2.9km walking.

Who needs to apply

Most students who already have a school travel pass in 2016 won't need to re-apply for next year However, you need to update student details online if the student:

Is moving from Year 2 to Year 3
Is moving from Year 6 to Year 7
Is changing schools or campuses
Is changing address

How to update your details

If the student already has a school travel pass and their address, school or name changes, or the student is entering Years 3 or 7, you will need to update your details at

apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updatedetails.

How to apply for a new travel pass

Applications for 2017 open from the start of Term 4, 2016.

Step 1

Once you have confirmed your 2017 school enrolment, complete the online application form at transportnsw.info/school-students, nominating your home address and which bus company or transport operator the student needs to travel between home and school.

Step 2

Print, sign and date the completed application, then return it to the student's school for endorsement.

Step 3

The school then sends the endorsed application to Transport for NSW. You will receive an email confirming the outcome of your application. If the application is approved, Transport for NSW will inform your local bus or transport operator who will send a school travel pass to the student's school, or in some cases, to the student's address.

A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over must apply for themselves.

Frequently asked questions

Can I still apply using a paper form? Carbon copy forms are no longer being accepted after Term 2, 2016. To download a paper form visit **apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts**.

How can I apply if I don't have internet access?

Call 131 500 for assistance with your application. Is a school travel pass valid outside

school hours?

School travel passes are only for travel to and from school. So for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays, students will need to purchase a ticket.

What if there's no public transport in my area?

In areas where there is no public transport, eligible NSW residents may receive a subsidy for transporting the student to school by private vehicle. For details visit transportnsw.info/school-students.

How do I apply if the student is in a shared parenting situation and needs to travel from two addresses?

Each parent (or the student if aged 16 or over) needs to make a separate application for each address. The same eligibility criteria apply.
