

Dramatic Minds

On Friday October 13, a team of Junee High School students participated in the 6th Annual Golden Plains Festival of Dramatic Minds. The Dramatic Minds Festival is a multimedia festival involving high school students focused on promoting mental health knowledge in the aims to reduce the stigma of mental health and present information in creative ways.



Our team consisted of Kiara Longmore, Ineka Hart, Taylah Hacket, Bella Willis, Chloe Hatch, Tenaya Gerhard, Lily-May Sutherland, Jasmine Phillips and Jamie Whiles. The team devised a dramatic dance sequence that depicted domestic violence and the flow on effects of

poor mental health and self-harm that can arise from these events impacting young lives. The piece highlighted the help seeking avenues young people can access if they are experiencing poor mental health as a result of trauma such as kids helpline, headspace, the Black dog Institute and Lifeline.

The students worked consistently to perfect their performance and choreographed many of the sequences themselves. A particular highlight of the piece was Jamie making his debut dance/acting career as a bad guy playing an abusive father of the piece. Jasmine also stepped up to play the wife who experiences domestic violence and Kiara their child who experiences the negative mental health that exposure to domestic violence. ensures performance had a very emotive powerful message and evocatively portrayed by these brave students. The team was widely praised on the day and received overall first place in the festival. This is the first time Junee High School has won the event and is testament to the hard work and dedication of these students.
