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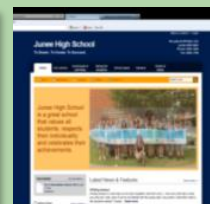

Monitoring Books

On occasion, a student may be given a Monitoring book for a Teacher level or an Executive level. The aim of the books is to monitor student behaviour, attendance and/or their completion of work, forming communication between teachers, Executive staff and parents. Students can be on a book for up to 10 days, but be taken off this book early with greatly improved behaviour and following school expectations.

If a student is on a Monitoring book and they receive an unsatisfactory record from a teacher due to classroom behaviour, the student will be under the supervision of either the Principal or Deputy Principal for the remainder of the day. While with them, the student is not to have their electronic device and will have learning to complete.

Victor Chang Award

Congratulations to Adam Spackman who was the 2017 Junee HS recipient of the Victor Chang award. The Victor Chang Cardiac Research Institute presents an award for the top achieving science student in each NSW Government school, with the very first Victor Chang award winner from Mt Druitt HS in 2006 going on after their university degree in medicine to work at the Victor Chang Institute, focussing on heart disease research.

Massive thanks to the staff and students who were part of the organisation and catering for this event. I received many thanks and congratulations for the people that put together this event and I thank them for their effort and care for making this event special for the 24 students, their families and their teachers and principals.

School Fees

Tell head lice to nick off!

How to control head lice

- 1 Detect**
Use metal comb and combing solution to detect and remove head lice and their eggs
- 2 Treat**
KPS has different types of head lice treatments, the latest RAPID, medicated and natural treatments. Use either treatment to kill head lice and break their life cycle.
- 3 Prevent**
Use egg remover and a metal comb to kill eggs and remove them from the head
- 4 Repeat**
Repeat the process after 7 days to effectively kill the cycle
- 5 Clean**
Wash bed linen and clothes in warm water with soaking solution to get rid of lice from home



How to identify head lice

- Head lice can be anything from greyish white to white in colour
- They are the size of a sesame seed
- Nits are the eggs, yellowish white in colour and are found on the hair shaft generally at the nape of the neck
- Adult lice may be found anywhere on the head
- Red bite marks or scratch marks are often seen on the back of the neck
- The eggs are sometimes mistaken for dandruff
- It takes several weeks exposure to the lice before itching develops
- Remember:**
 - Head lice has nothing to do with hygiene
 - Head lice don't like short and plaited hair
 - The lice don't hop, jump or fly
 - Don't share hats, head bands or pillows
