Positive Behaviour for Learning

Junee High School is using the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) framework for a whole school focus. Our school team have designed a matrix so everyone will understand the expected behaviours in a range of school settings. Great feedback from students has aided this. The team has started teaching specific lessons about the expected behaviours, with our SRC involved in creating videos to explicitly demonstrate the expected behaviours, focused on our 3 B's of Be your Best, Be respectful, Be Responsible.

Parents, students and community members will see more signage around the school outlining the expected behaviours at each place, such as the office, canteen, hallways and classrooms.

What's happening in Careers?

Year 10 Mock Interview Program

Stage 5 students will be involved in a mock interview program being held at Junee High School on Wednesday 29 November 2017 between Period 1 – Period 5. This program will form the basis of the final task for their Careers lessons and is therefore compulsory for all Stage 5 students. The opportunity for our students to participate in this program is an important and a vital preparation step for their future job seeking endeavours.

Students are asked to come to school in either full school uniform or dressed for an interview and to bring with them a copy of their resume (this will be worked on at school). Students who have developed a portfolio containing relevant documentation (school report, Certificates of Merit, copies of qualifications) are asked to bring this along also. Students will have a rostered time for their interview and will attend class for the remainder of the day.



Interviews should last for about 10 minutes with a further 5 minutes being allocated for discussion. The students will be being interviewed by representatives from TAFE, GTES & ATEL as well as representatives from other community organisations.

A BBQ lunch will be provided for the students on the day.

Junee Public School Careers program

Research would support that children from quite a young age are already thinking about the types of jobs they want to do when they leave school. It also supports the introduction of careers education in the early school years. To support this research 17 student volunteers from Stage 5 are currently involved in a Careers Based program with Year 1-2 students at Junee Public School. I do not know who was more excited on



the first visit the 'little kids' or the 'big kids'. The program will run one afternoon per week for 5 weeks. Each week starts with a story book that looks at a career/job(s) and is then followed by career based activity.







