Principal's Message

Education Week

2017 theme was "I Learn, We Learn".

Thanks to all parents and students that were able to attend our events last week, especially the subject selection evening. It was great to have the opportunity to speak about student's learning and their future learning choices.

Community Consultation

On Thursday July 20, JHS hosted leaders and community members from the Junee shire for a community consultation breakfast. Each of the five Ngumba-Dal schools were able to present a brief talk about their school, then allowing guests to provide feedback on the schools, highlighting what is important to them about our schools. This information is valuable to us and will be used to inform our future school plan.

The survey attached to this newsletter is able to be completed and returned to JHS, either electronically, mailed or handed in. Thanks for your input.

Head Teacher Classification

Currently we have four permanent Head teachers as part of our Executive team: Miss Prue Asmus – English/ History/ LOTE; Ms Jen Hoy – Teaching & Learning Miss Emma Turvey – TAS; Mrs Sandra Heffernan – Relieving Mathematics & Science.

Mrs Fiona Collins has relinquished her position as Head Teacher Mathematics, which means that we are in the process of searching for a permanent replacement. I am considering changing the Head Teacher Mathematics role to Head Teacher Science, which includes the Maths faculty.

There seems to be a larger number of teachers with Science qualifications able to apply for this role rather than Maths qualifications, thus giving the panel a wider range of qualified and excellent candidates to choose from.

Irrelevant of the change, we are keeping the Maths and Science faculties together, to allow teachers to collaborate, team-teach and plan great STEM and cross-curricular lessons, providing greater links between both faculties. This change can be made after consultation with the community. If you have any comment about this matter, please make an appointment to discuss it with me.

Scripture Classes

We thank the Junee Christian Education Board for their involvement and support of our school. Scripture classes will resume in week 5 of this term. Stage 4 classes will each participate in one lesson on a Friday. In line with the guidelines for Scripture in NSW Government schools, students have the option to "optout" of scripture. Students participating in nonscripture will participate in ethics-based activities with their usual classroom teacher and the school chaplain for support. A timetable with further information will be distributed to Stage 4 students.

Tell Them From Me Student and Parents Surveys

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey and the *Partners in Learning* parent survey.

The student survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help improve how they do things at school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 21 August and 13 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home with students. If you **do not** want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by **25 August 2017**. The parent survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's

experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPad, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 21 August and 13 October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

School Ball

2018 will see our EMPOWER Self-Select class continue.

We will hold an information session at our Learning Centre on Wednesday August 23 to explain the Self-Select process, as well as distribute application forms. These classes will be available for Stage 4 (Year 7 & 8) and Stage 5 (Year 9 & 10).

THE IMPACT OF PRIVACY LAW ON THE INFORMATION PARENTS CAN BE PROVIDED ABOUT OTHER PARENT'S CHILDREN

Our school holds information about our students. Some of this information is highly sensitive.

The way this information is collected, used, disclosed and secured by our school is subject to NSW legislation including the <u>Privacy and Personal</u> <u>Information Protection Act 1998</u>, <u>Health Records and</u> <u>Information Protection Act 2002</u> and the <u>Children and</u> <u>Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act 1998</u>.

These laws limit the circumstances in which your child's information can be disclosed to other parents. They also limit the circumstances in which you can be provided with information about action the school has taken in relation to other people's children.

This means, for example, you may not be provided with complete details of the action the school has taken in relation to a student who has engaged in unacceptable behaviour that has impacted on your child.

You should not assume that no action has been taken because you cannot be provided with information about what the school has done to deal with an issue relating to your child's interaction with another student.

Our school takes inappropriate behaviour from students very seriously and responds to that behaviour consistent with the school's student discipline and welfare procedures.

Tell Them From Me student survey: Information and consent form for parents and carers



Dear Parents and Carers

In Term 3 2017, our school is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed on-line and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar**, which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will <u>not</u> be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

As well as schools getting student feedback, the Department of Education, through the Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE), has access to data from across NSW and is running a research project to look at state-wide patterns of student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The research is looking at how these things impact on student outcomes, including academic performance. Individual students will <u>not</u> be identified in any CESE publications, and all information will be handled in accordance with the relevant privacy legislation. Students' personal information will not be disclosed by the Department to any other person or body other than as required by law.

This research will help schools in New South Wales to better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will also help teachers and principals discuss what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped.

If you <u>do not want</u> your child to take part in the survey, please complete the attached form and return it to the school by Friday 25 August 2017.
