Principal's Report

Hi all

I hope this finds you well.

Thank you for your support of our school and continuing our journey together in the education of people here in Junee.

Subject to the 10 day appeal process, I have been successful through merit selection to gain the principal position at Keira High School in Wollongong. This will be my last term here at Junee HS, with my last day on Friday 25 June.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time here, leading this great school and am proud of the achievements and growth of students, staff and our school community. There has been a lot of change over the past 5 & 1/2 years, with many improvements to the grounds & facilities, but it has been the improvements in school culture and pride in the school I have been proud of the most.

I have been able to work with wonderful families who want to see their child safe, happy and learning; supportive staff who want great things for their students; and great community members who see the strengths of young people and want to help them. I look back fondly on 2 AgVision events, many assemblies and presentation events, transition days and welcoming new families to school, as well as great learning in classes where students answered "Why does this learning matter?". I know that I am a better person for being here and will always speak highly of the fantastic people here.

Special shout out to the Year 12 class that I started with in 2016. Out of 43 students who started Year 7,

a number arrived and a number have left, and 16 are currently enrolled. I will be thinking of you in Term 3 as you finalise your secondary schooling with a number of significant events, including the School Ball and Graduation assembly, before your exams.

The process for appointing a new Principal is currently being worked out by the Director, Educational Leadership. There will be a Principal leading the school in Term 3 and I will work with them once they are appointed to support them. Mr Mark Turner will continue as Deputy Principal and will support the new Principal, staff and school community. Junee High School gave me the opportunity to grow as a leader and be able to cooperate with many wonderful people. I know that the school community will embrace a new principal with a heart for helping and caring for the students of the school, like you did for me in 2016.

Staffing

Thank you to families for your understanding as we try to ensure continuity of learning in classes while we experience staff shortages

For the remainder of Term 2, there will be changes in a number of classes to increase teachers in front of students. These include:

- 3 year 7 classes being combined into 2 classes

- 2 year 10 maths classes combined to 1 class.

I have been in contact with the Department's Staffing Unit. We have gained a PDHPE teacher to start Term 3. We are hoping to confirm a Maths teacher will also start at the beginning of term 3.

Currently we are in the process of appointing a permanent SLSO into the Support Unit. Their position will begin in Term 3.

We continue to have a number of great staff members working at school. Currently we are fielding enquiries from people interested in SLSO and SASS work, with some casual vacancies. Interested community members can contact me for an appointment to discuss opportunities

Soft skills are those personal attributes that will help you succeed at study – and life. Things like:

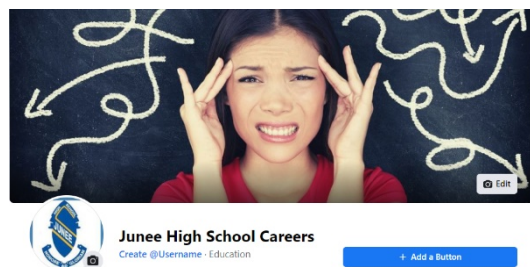
