Principal's Report

Thank you for the warm welcome and support I have received from staff, students, parents and the wider community. It is my absolute honour and privilege to lead Junee High School and continue to build on the great work of Scott Frazier. Students have approached me in the playground to introduce themselves and many have asked me if I am enjoying my time here. Strategic Improvement Plan - Our 2021-2024 Strategic Improvement Plan has been finalised and is available for parents and the community to view on our website. The plan outlines our three strategic directions, including key initiatives, as we work towards improving student outcomes in the areas of reading, numeracy, HSC Bands, student wellbeing and attendance. A focus for staff is on how they use data to reflect on their teaching and modify their teaching practice to best meet student needs.

Staff Development Days

What do teachers and support staff DO on a Staff Development Day?

On Monday July 12, all our staff were involved in professional learning, discussion, workshops and planning so that they are further equipped to lead and support learning in all classrooms for all students.

Our teachers reviewed the literacy and numeracy data from the Term 2 Year 8 Check-in Assessment and the Term 1 Year 7 Best Start data. As we wait for the Year 7 and 9 NAPLAN data, Year 9 teachers reflected on the achievement of students in their classes to date to consider what the strengths and areas for improvement of their students are. All teachers developed a class profile for one class and explored the School Improvement Resources which have recently been published by the Department of Education. Teachers selected a specific literacy or numeracy focus area and planned to explicitly teach in order to improve student learning outcomes. Students can expect that in various classes, learning HOW to read will feature in lessons. This may involve skim reading to grasp the main idea, reading with greater depth and understanding, reading more frequently and broadening their understanding of subject specific words.

Our Student Learning Support Officers explored topics which related to the work they do, in classrooms, to support teachers to move students along in their learning journey.

They explored strategies and ideas including supporting students to attempt all learning and to develop resilience. They know that learning can be stressful but that with support, ALL students can learn.

Take a moment to look up:

* Growth Mindset versus Fixed Mindset and you too will understand that the brain is a muscle. The brain CAN change and become stronger, with effort.

*Process praise versus person praise.
