Preparing for the HSC

Have you recently moved house or family circumstances changed?

When you or your child's circumstances change, there may be many things to consider. It is vital that when changes occur, you notify the school **in writing** as soon as possible. This enables us to provide the correct support to your child and to communicate with the appropriate person, should the need arise. For example, are your details accurate and current if your child becomes ill or is injured while at school?

Think about when you last updated your child's information. For some this may have been upon enrolment, several years ago.

Please consider the following:

- ? Are your contact details and emergency contact details correct and current?
- ? Has your child has received a medical diagnosis which could impact them while at school? (such as a serious allergic reaction)
- ? have you changed address?

To make the required changes to your child's records, we must receive notification in writing from a custodial parent or legal guardian.
